



Immediately report all spills

Hazardous Substance Spills

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) in accordance with AS 46.03.755 and 18 AAC 75 Article 3 requires reporting of any release of a hazardous substance as soon as the person has knowledge of the discharge.

Oil/Petroleum Spills

Report oil/petroleum discharges to ADEC and Merrill Field management as follows:

- 1 to 10 gallons: monthly.
- 10 to 55 gallons: within 48 hours.
- Over 55 gallons: immediately.
- Document all spills in the leaseholder Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP).

Spill Response Kit

Spill response kits shall contain the necessary tools and equipment to immediately respond to spills. By treating the spill immediately, the potential for the hazardous material entering the storm water system is greatly reduced.

Put together your spill response kit and make sure it is stored in a convenient location for quick access. Be familiar with what is in the kit and use it in the event of any kind of spill. Educate your staff/employees on the best management practices (BMPs).

Spill Response Kit Contents:

- Absorbent Pads (Oil, Gas, & Diesel)
- Universal Absorbent Pads (Antifreeze & Non-Hazardous Materials)
- Oil Absorbent Pillows
- Absorbent Socks (Oil, Gas, & Diesel)
- Hazmat Disposal Bags (trash bags)
- Pair of Goggles
- Pair of Nitrile Gloves
- Spill Instruction Sheet
- Laminated List of Contents

Other spill equipment may be added to the kit as desired/required.

Spill Response Kit Container

The spill response kit needs to be housed within a Rubbermaid Action Packer®, drum, bucket with a lid, or equivalent. The container needs to be clearly marked and easily transported.

Spilled material must be removed in accordance with AMC 11.60.280. Failure to properly clean up a spill will result in a \$300 fine (AMC 14.60).
