



Immediately report all spills

Hazardous Substance Spills

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) in accordance with AS 46.03.755 and 18 AAC 75 Article 3 requires reporting of any release of a hazardous substance as soon as the person has knowledge of the discharge.

Oil/Petroleum Spills

Report oil/petroleum discharges to ADEC and Merrill Field management as follows:

- 1 to 10 gallons: monthly.
- 10 to 55 gallons: within 48 hours.
- Over 55 gallons: immediately.
- Document all spills in the leaseholder Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP).

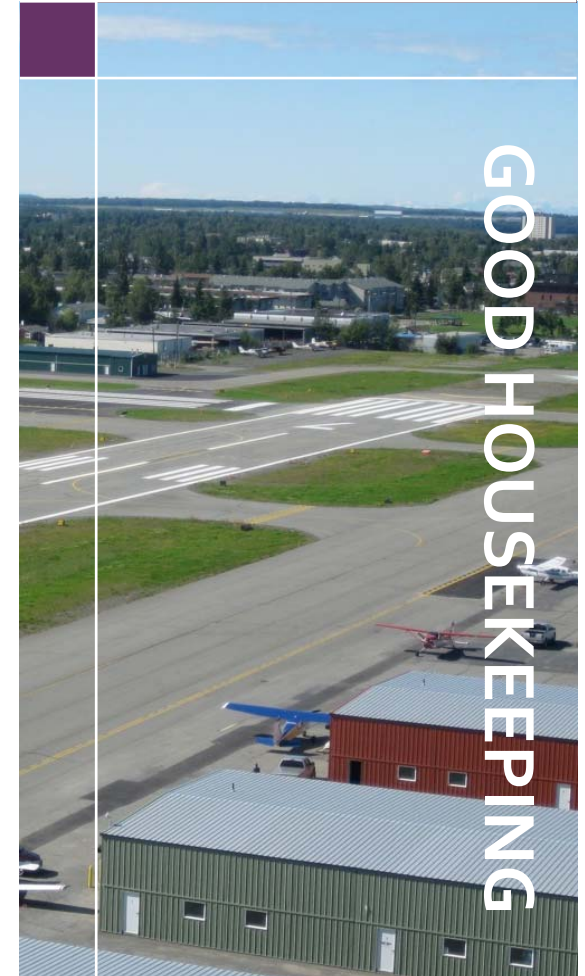

Merrill Field Best Practices

Storm water discharge practices protecting Anchorage's streams

Good Housekeeping

By practicing basic good housekeeping measures, the chance of pollutants getting into the storm drains, and eventually the streams and wetlands of Anchorage, is greatly reduced.

Merrill Field management is doing its part, but we need all of the airport users to do their part as well.

As an airport user, you may see things that could be improved to reduce the potential for pollution. If you have ideas or see problems please contact Merrill Field management.

To help prevent storm water pollution, please take care to:

- Keep a spill response kit at the fueling area.
- Store portable fuel trailers in an area that limits leaks or spills and the tanks must be equipped with overflow protection or shutoff valves.
- Keep spill containment equipment with portable fuel trailers at all times.
- Portable fuel trailers must be marked with owner's name and material name.
- Dispose of dirty rags, oily towels, batteries, and used parts in accordance with AMC 11.60.290. Do not use the dumpsters for anything but trash.
- Use drip pads under leaking equipment.

- Do not dispose of used oil in waste cans labeled "No Oil."
- Ensure that all materials, products, oil and hazardous materials are properly labeled, closed, and covered. Materials should also be placed in a controlled area with secondary containment (AMC 11.60.170).
- Wash your aircraft only at an approved washing station (AMC 11.60.340).
- Failure to properly dispose of waste will result in a \$300 fine (AMC 14.60).

As part of its commitment to prevent storm water pollution, airport personnel will perform regular drive-by inspections of the airport area and note any practices that may compromise storm water runoff.
